Proverbs 12:12-22

¹² Whoever is wicked covets the spoil of evildoers, but the root of the righteous bears fruit. ¹³ An evil man is ensnared by the transgression of his lips but the righteous escapes from trouble. ¹⁴ From the fruit of his mouth a man is satisfied with good, and the work of a man's hand comes back to him. ¹⁵ The way of a fool is right in his own eyes, but a wise man listens to advice. ¹⁶ The vexation of a fool is known at once, but the prudent ignores an insult.

¹⁷ Whoever speaks the truth gives honest evidence, but a false witness utters deceit. ¹⁸ There is one whose rash words are like sword thrusts, but the tongue of the wise brings healing. ¹⁹ Truthful lips endure forever, but a lying tongue is but for a moment. ²⁰ Deceit is in the heart of those who devise evil, but those who plan peace have joy. ²¹ No ill befalls the righteous, but the wicked are filled with trouble. ²² Lying lips are an abomination to the Lord, but those who act faithfully are his delight.


Proverbs 12:12-22 "The Fruit of the Righteous"
